Reading a Story

Children are supported in choosing a book they would like to read together. The adult can then read the book getting the children involved by stopping and asking questions, also encouraging the children to talk about the pictures. Whilst reading parents can get children involved by asking them to turn the pages. When reading a familiar book parents can leave out repeated phrases so children can fill them in from memory.



This activity is to help children in learning new words and repeating familiar phrases. You can even stop reading the story half way and ask your child to think of an alternate ending!
